- Open Entry Registration: July 1 Sept. 1 All entries must be received in the Entry Office by midnight of the closing date. Late entries will not be accepted.

RULES and REGULATIONS

The South Carolina State Fair General Rules and Regulations shall apply.

PREMIUM CHECKS

- 1. Exhibitors awarded over \$599.00 must produce a valid, signed W-9 to be awarded premium (prize) monies.
- 2. Premiums will be paid within thirty (30) days after the close of the Fair.
- Premium checks not cashed in ninety (90) days of issue date become void and will not be reissued.
- 4. Lost or stolen premium checks will not be reissued past sixty (60) days of original issue date.
- No claim that a premium(s) has not been paid, or that there was a discrepancy in payment of the premium(s) won, will be considered when claim is made later than November 30 following the Fair.

ENTRY REGISTRATION

- Online entry registration is the preferred method for registering entries.
 A link to the ShoWorks entry system is found on the SC State Fair website at www.scstatefair.org/competitions
- 2. Online entry registrations are confirmed at time of submission.
- 3. Print/save and bring your confirmation to present at check-in.
- An exhibitor may opt to mail an entry form and must include a selfaddressed, stamped legal size envelope to receive a return confirmation that the entry form was received.
- 5. The Show Manager may reject any applications that are not properly prepared or that are received or postmarked after September 1.

ENTRY REGISTRATION CONFIRMATION

- . Online entry registrations are confirmed at time of submission.
- Exhibitors who postal mail their entry registrations and desire a confirmation must include a self-addressed, stamped business size envelope. Please do not telephone the Fair or Entry Office.
- Confirmation letters, pre-purchased Animal Trailer Parking Passes, and two (2) wristbands for each Rider/Handler (youth exhibitor) will be mailed in late September to the Responsible Party for Exhibitors.
- Contact Brenda Baldwin, Youth Horse Show Superintendent, if the letter is not received one week (7 days) prior to the show.

EQUINE SCHOLARSHIPS

REGISTRATION NOTES

- A Responsible Party should complete the entry form with the Riders and Handlers being classified as Exhibitors.
- All premiums will be paid to the Responsible Party. It is this person's responsibility to distribute this money as they see fit.
- The Birth Date of each Rider/Handler should be listed on the Entry Registration Form for all classes.
- Exhibitors in the NOVICE CLASSES may not enter any other class that requires a canter or a lope (see NOVICE DIVISION ENTRANCE paragraph).
- Refunds will NOT be given if the exhibitor is entered in the incorrect class (es); however, every effort will be made to move the exhibitor to an appropriate class (es).
- 6. Class changes/additions may be made only during check-in on the show date; any additional fee payment must be in the form of cash following the entry closing date. In addition to each \$10.00 per class entry fee, a class change fee of \$10.00 per class for each class change or addition will be assessed only during check-in (Reminder: CASH ONLY).
- 7. Premiums will be paid only if all show fees have been paid.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

- The original Coggins report dated within the last twelve (12) months
 prior to the show is required and must be presented to the Youth Horse
 Superintendent upon arrival at the fairgrounds or during check-in.
- DO NOT MAIL the Coggins report with the entry form. All out-of-state animals must have a health certificate issued within thirty (30) days of the show by a licensed and accredited veterinarian.
- All vaccinations should be current. All animals must appear in good flesh and health.
- 4. The Superintendent of the Youth Horse Show has the right to request that any animal which appears to be in poor health or condition be removed from the fairgrounds.

EXHIBITOR AGE REQUIREMENTS

- Exhibitors must be nineteen (19) years of age or under as of January 1
 of the current year. This is also applied to each age division, i.e., 12
 and under class entrants must be 12 or younger as of January 1.
- 2. The Superintendent of the Youth Horse Superintendent has the right to request proof of age if an entry is contested.

GATE ADMISSION POLICY (VERY IMPORTANT - PLEASE READ)

To provide and ensure the necessary parking space for towing vehicles transporting show animals for exhibit at the SC State Fair, livestock exhibitors must adhere to the following policy:

- Vehicles towing animals enter Gate 4 on Rosewood Drive
- Vehicles not towing animals enter Gate 6 (must have prepurchased tickets if arriving before fair opens)

GATE 4 - VEHICLES TOWING ANIMALS:

- Parking passes for animal trailer towing vehicles may be purchased for \$25.00 only at the time of registration.
- Trainers bringing in horses must have one of their clients purchase a pass during registration if all clients are individually responsible for their entries.
- 3. No vehicle will be allowed to turn into Gate 4 without a pass unless it is towing an animal trailer.
- Any vehicle inside the Gate 4 parking area without a pass displayed will be towed at the owner's expense.

GATE 6 - VEHICLES NOT TOWING ANIMALS:

 This includes Youth Horse Show exhibitors (Responsible Party, riders/handlers) not towing a horse trailer, spectators, family members

- and auxiliary for exhibitors may park in the Gate 6 PARKING lot on Assembly Street. If this parking area is full, you will need to find parking elsewhere.
- Advance purchase of admission tickets (\$10) is advised for those family members, friends, etc. that will not be in possession of one of the exhibitor wristbands.
- 3. These tickets are taken up or scanned at the gate each time you enter.

PARKING LIMITATIONS

No trailer or vehicle parking at the barns, in front of the stalls, or driveways between barns, or in the inside aisles.

HORSE STALL RESERVATIONS

Stalls are limited and must be reserved with the Youth Horse Superintendent. Please complete the stall reservation form found in Links on page 1. There is no fee for stalls.

TACK STALL RENTAL

Available ONLY at time of registration for \$25.00 per stall.

HOOK-UPS LOTTERY

We have moved to a Hook-ups Lottery instead of First-Come basis. Hookups are limited and must be reserved. Please complete the RV/reservation form. There is no charge for hook-ups. Hook-ups are NOT guaranteed.

DRUG TESTING

The Show Committee and the SC State Fair reserve the right to test any animal at any time for suspected drug abuse to be paid for by the exhibitor of the animal.

*NOVICE DIVISION ENTRANTS PLEASE READ:

WALK/TROT and WALK/JOG CLASSES

- A NOVICE is defined as an exhibitor that is his/her first year of showing as determined by the SC State Fair entry system.
- 2. This does not apply to green horses or new mounts.
- All NOVICE entrants are not eligible to enter any of the classes that are not in the NOVICE Division, i.e., any class that requires a canter or lope.
- Entrant may enter any other class that is noted as a NOVICE class.

CLASS PROCEDURES:

- A list of entries will be posted prior to the beginning of each day's classes.
- 2. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to confirm the correctness of his/her entries and to be at the in-gate at the appropriate time.
- 3. If the entry is NOT listed on the class roster, your entry must be cleared by the show office prior to being allowed into the arena.
- The posted roster will serve as the 'order of go' in individual run classes. It will be announced if a reverse order of go will be applied to selected classes.
- Exhibitors not displaying their show (back) number will be asked to leave the ring.
- All animals entered in the show or stalled in the barns must be manageable or will be excused from the ring or asked to leave the grounds.

Speed Event Classes:

- All exhibitors must wear long pants, a long-sleeved shirt with a collar, cowboy boots and an approved safety helmet.
- 2. The exhibitor may not be tied or secured in the saddle in any fashion.
- 3. Due to the unique show environment of the SC State Fair and the show facility and in attempt assure a safer environment, exhibitors will NOT be allowed to begin running until they enter the gate and will stop at a closed arena gate, i.e. there will be no running starts allowed due to the lack of a secured alleyway.

Western Classes:

- All exhibitors must wear long pants, a long-sleeved shirt with a collar, cowboy boots and a western hat.
- Current western fashion trends, such as horsemanship shirts, meet these standards.
- 3. Chaps are optional.
- 4. While safety helmets are not required, they are strongly recommended.
- 5. The exhibitor may not be tied or secured in the saddle in any fashion.

Hunter Over Fences Classes

 An exhibitor may only enter in classes of TWO fence heights, i.e., 18" & 2'; 2' & 2'3"; 2' & 2'6"

Ranch Horse Classes

Ranch Ground Handling – Classes 25-28 – Entries judged on handler's ability to communicate with the horse through a series of maneuvers that simulate tasks on the ranch such as turns on the forehand or haunches, backing, moving forward at a wall/trot/extended trot, standing square at the end of a loose lead, side passing or lateral maneuvers. Horses to be shown in a plain leather, nylon, or rope/cotton halter. Silver halters are not allowed.

Ranch Pleasure – Classes 29-32 – Entries judged on performance, suitability as a ranch horse, manners, and way of going. To be judged along the rail at the walk, trot, and lope (WT classes walk and trot only). All entries are required to back and judges may ask for extensions of the walk and trot. If ridden with two hands a regulation snaffle must be used. (Refer to AQHA level 1/SC 4H rules) Curb bits must be used with one hand (neck reining).

Ranch Riding – Classes 33-36 - Entries judged individually on a pattern to include the walk, trot, and lope (WT classes walk and trot only) as well as lead changes (simple or flying judged equally), turns, backing and crossing logs. Patterns to be chosen from the current AQHA/SC 4H State rule book. The horse is judged on performance, suitability as a ranch horse, manners, and way of going.

SC STATE FAIR PRESIDENT'S CHOICE AWARD Silver Belt Buckle

Purpose:

The President's Award was designed to bestow the highest recognition to an outstanding specie exhibitor of the South Carolina State Fair who has demonstrated exceptional involvement in the livestock industry, advocate for agriculture and recognized as a recipient of the highest honor of the South Carolina State Fair.

Selection: President Award Recipients will be selected in the following species: Jr Beef, Open Beef, Jr Dairy, Open Dairy, Dairy Goat, Jr Market Goat, Jr Market Lamb, Sheep, Smallstock, Jr Swine, Open Swine, and Youth Horse.

Guidelines:

- The South Carolina State Fair President's Competition is open to all 2023 South Carolina State Fair youth and open exhibitors (exhibitor is defined as an individual that exhibits an animal show in a minimum of one class in one specie show.)
- Contestants may only compete in one specie area in which they are currently exhibiting.
- Once a youth exhibitor is recognized with the President's Award, they
 will not be eligible to compete for this award in the same specie again.
 Youth winners are eligible to compete in the open division in future
 years.
- Once an open exhibitor is recognized with the President's Award, they will not be eligible to compete in future years.

Selection Information:

 This distinguished award will be selected by the specie superintendent and the specie support staff.

The intent of this prestigious award is determined on the following Youth Horse criteria:

- Overall presentation of horse and exhibitor.
- Horse is well groomed, well cared for, and in fit condition.
- Tack is well maintained and clean.
- Exhibitor is well groomed and appropriately attired.
- Overall exhibits good horsemanship.
- Courtesy to other exhibitors, spectators and show officials will count towards the award. Disregard for show and facility rules and regulations will count against award calculations.
- Positive interaction with the public during the designated species competition time frame, where applicable.
- Exhibits good sportsmanship throughout the show.
