******Highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI) H5N1 is affecting lactating dairy cattle in the United States. USDA Veterinary Services has issued a federal order changing the importation requirements of lactating dairy cattle.

******The SC State Veterinarian's office is working with the South Carolina State Fair on updating guidelines to reflect these changes for entry of lactating dairy cows onto the fairgrounds.

GENERAL INFORMATION

FEES & PARKING

- 1. Fees apply to Open and Junior Dairy show exhibitors.
- 2. ENTRY FEE: \$20 per head / class
- 3. **VEHICLE HANGTAG**: One (1) complimentary Gate 4 vehicle hang tag per exhibitor and will be mailed to exhibitor in late September.
- 4. Dairy Cattle exhibitors requiring additional Gate 4 hang tags for delivering animals or tack may purchase at time of entry registration.
- 5. <u>RV Camper:</u> (see <u>Reserve RV Parking</u>)

TOTAL PREMIUMS OFFERED

\$71,150 (This figure does not include value of other awards, i.e., ribbons, rosettes, banners, belt buckles, gift cards, scholarships, etc.)

PREMIUM CHECKS

- 1. Exhibitors awarded over \$599.00 must present valid, signed W-9 to be awarded premium (prize) monies.
- 2. Premiums will be paid within thirty (30) days after the close of the Fair.
- 3. Premium checks not cashed in ninety (90) days of issue date become void and will not be reissued.
- 4. Lost or stolen premium checks will not be reissued past 60 days (60) days of original issue date.
- 5. No claim that a premium(s) has not been paid, or that there was a discrepancy in payment of the premium(s) won, will be considered when claim is made later than November 30 following the Fair.
- 6. Premiums may be withheld if the bedding area is left unclean. Junior Dairy exhibits are expected to be maintained in a clean and orderly manner. Failure to do so may result in forfeiture of premium money.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

BREEDS (Open and Junior Shows)

Ayrshire, Brown Swiss, Guernsey, Holstein, Jersey

All animals shown must be registered with their National Breed Association and have a GR status of 75% or greater.

EXHIBITOR ELIGIBILITY

- 1. **Open Shows** Open to all dairy animals recognized by their breed specifications.
- 2. **Junior Shows** Open to South Carolina and out-of-state 4-H and FFA members. Exhibitors must be no younger than 5 years of age as of the show date and no older than the 4-H or FFA membership requirement age as of January 1 of the current year.

RULES and REGULATIONS: The South Carolina State Fair General Rules and Regulations shall apply. As an exhibitor in the SC State Fair, you agree to the following:

- 1. I have reviewed and agree to abide by the rules and regulations set forth in the online 2025 SC STATE FAIR EXHIBITS GUIDE.
- 2. Upon delivery of my entry, I acknowledge that others will be using said facilities and premises at the same time and that the State Agricultural & Mechanical Society of South Carolina, aka The South Carolina State Fair, is not responsible for the acts, property, equipment and animals of others or the acts or products of any concessionaire.
- 3. I agree that photos of exhibits taken by official fair representatives may be used on the South Carolina State Fair website and social media outlets, such as Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, Pinterest, etc.
- 4. I acknowledge that the State Agricultural & Mechanical Society of South Carolina, aka The South Carolina State Fair, is not responsible for any loss, injury, illness, or damage to any animals or property or exhibit articles and that such understanding and agreement is a condition of my entry or exhibit.
- 5. Further, I agree to and hereby indemnify the State Agriculture & Mechanical Society, aka The South Carolina State Fair, from any loss, injury, damage or claim of any third person caused by any animal, exhibit, entry or property of mine or any act of anyone or mine acting on my behalf.

DAIRY CATTLE REGISTRATION PAPERS

- 1. Required for all cattle over six months of age and should remain at the SC State Fair until completion of cattle shows.
- 2. No animals accepted with PENDING registration over six months of age.
- 3. At the discretion of the Management, registration papers may be called for in the Show Ring on all animals showing in Group classes.
- 4. The certificate of registration or signed AFFIDAVIT on each animal shown in the Junior Dairy Show must be recorded in one individual's name.
- 5. Certificates of registrations or signed AFFIDAVIT must be presented to the Superintendent upon arrival at the Fairgrounds, which proves the exhibitor to be the owner when the entry was made. No transfer slips or photocopies will be accepted.

OWNERSHIP

- Any exhibitor registering an animal in any name other than the bona fide owner, or owners, or showing an animal in a class for which it is not eligible, may, at the discretion of the Management, be barred from further showing, and any or all premiums previously awarded may be forfeited.
- 2. In all Group Classes, only one (1) entry, per exhibitor, per class is allowed. Bring individual registration papers to show ring at time of judging. All animals per registration form must be the same owner.
- 3. The breeder of an animal is the owner of the cow at the time of service.
- 4. Animals owned in partnership may be registered in proper classes in one (1) owner's name. Entry shall carry a footnote showing the actual ownership of the animal as appearing on the herd book records.

BLOOD TYPING

For Parentage Verification – Refer to the Association Rules.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Cattle must conform to <u>SC Animal Health Requirements.</u>
- 2. Cattle crossing state lines (out-of-state) for showing require a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI, health certificate) and official individual identification (tattoos and brands are NOT acceptable for interstate movement).

Individual identification must be recorded on the CVI.

- a. For **Non-Lactating dairy cattle,** the CVI must be written within thirty (30) days of the show and must accompany the cattle on arrival.
- b. For **Lactating dairy cattle**, must follow the Federal Order movement guidelines. Move within SEVEN (7) days of testing for HPAI H5N1.
- c. Brucellosis and TB testing are not required for cattle originating from Brucellosis Free and Tuberculosis Free <u>States</u>.
- All out-of-state lactating dairy cattle must have their composite milk sampled by an official milk tester, tested at a NAHLN approved laboratory and test negative for HPAI H5N1 within 7 days of entering the fairgrounds. (2025 Federal Order for interstate movement). <u>Suggested</u> testing October 3 or 4.
- All South Carolina lactating dairy cattle must have their composite or bulk tank milk sampled by an official milk tester, tested at a NAHLN approved laboratory (Clemson Veterinary Diagnostic Center) and test negative for HPAI H5N1 within 7 days of entering the fairgrounds. (SC State Veterinarian for intrastate exhibition). <u>Suggested testing October 3 or 4.</u>
- 5. Please call Clemson Livestock Poultry Health at 803.788.2260 or visit **Clemson LPH HPAI Dairy Cattle website** for additional information.

ENTRY REGISTRATION

- 1. Online entry registration is the preferred method for registering entries. A link to the ShoWorks entry system is found on the SC State Fair website at <u>www.scstatefair.org/competitions</u>
- 2. Online entry registrations are confirmed by email at time of submission.
- 3. Print/save and bring your confirmation on Delivery Day.
- 4. An exhibitor may opt to mail an entry form and must include a self-addressed, stamped legal size envelope to receive a return confirmation that the entry form was received.
- 5. The Show Manager may reject any applications that are not properly prepared or that are received or postmarked after September 1.
- 6. Cattle not registered in the show will not be allowed on the grounds unless permission is obtained from the Show Manager prior to the Show.

CONFIRMATION LETTER & ARRIVAL TO FAIRGROUNDS – GATE 4

A Confirmation Letter and Vehicle Hangtag(s) will be mailed to all cattle exhibitors from the Show Secretary in late September.

- 1. All Dairy Cattle registered in both the Open and Junior shows will be received on Thursday and must be checked in no later than 12:00 pm. (Noon). No changes will be made after the books are closed. No exceptions!
- 2. Enter Gate 4 on George Rogers Blvd. with Vehicle Hangtag visible through vehicle windshield. The hangtag should remain visible in the windshield while on the fairgrounds.
- 3. Appropriate registration certificate on each animal must be presented to the Cattle Superintendent upon arrival.

PARKING

- 1. No vehicle will be allowed to park adjacent to any of the cattle barns.
- 2. Exhibitors will load/unload their supplies and move their trucks to the parking area designated by the Superintendent.

STALLS

- 1. Entry fees do not dictate stall space.
- 2. Exhibitors will receive stalls only for animals delivered to the fair.

CHECK-IN

- 1. As entries are received by the Dairy Show manager, registrations will be checked on their respective breed association website for ownership and accuracy of information submitted.
- 2. Registration papers showing ownership in the exhibitors' name must be presented at checkin.

SHOWING MULTIPLE ANIMALS

- 1. If any Junior Dairy exhibitor enters multiple animals in any Junior Dairy Show, he/she must show at least one (1) entry in each class in which they have animals entered.
- 2. Junior Dairy exhibitors may enter multiple animals in any Junior Dairy Show class (except showmanship classes) but each animal must be shown by a Junior Dairy exhibitor.

HERD

While an adult exhibitor's herd is registered in the names of different members of his family, all residents on one (1) farm, and while the herd is one (1) unit, all entries may be considered as a single exhibitor for Premier Breeder, Best Three Females, and Exhibitor's Herd classes; however, entries from the Junior Show wanting to exhibit in the Open Show classes of Best Three Females and Exhibitors Herd classes must be in the individual Junior member's name and must meet the criteria of the two (2) Group Classes.

SHOWMANSHIP CLASS

Junior Dairy Show exhibitors must show their animal in the confirmation class to quality for showmanship classes.

DAIRY COWS IN MILK

- 1. Dairy cows in milk will be milked in the milking parlor unless given permission not to be milked by the Superintendent.
- 2. All treated cows will be milked last.

DRESS CODE

- 1. Open Dairy Show exhibitors are required to wear a show harness and must provide their own.
- 2. Junior Dairy Show exhibitors must wear a plain collared shirt while exhibiting, no caps to be worn in the ring.

CARE, FEED, & BEDDING OF CATTLE

- 1. The owner is responsible for feeding, bedding, and care of their animals.
- 2. Cattle are to be watered and fed in stalls or at tie-outs, not on wash rack, in aisles or doorways. Each exhibitor is requested to limit the amount of feed and hay brought into the show barn to one (1) days' supply.
- 3. A \$10.00 per head, per day charge will be assessed to 4-H, FFA, or adult exhibitors who fail to feed and water their cattle or maintain a clean exhibit.

BEDDING

- 1. No straw bedding allowed in barns.
- 2. No straw in tie-outs.
- 3. Initial bedding free.

CHUTES

- 1. No blocking chutes will be allowed in the barns.
- 2. They may be placed in a designated area adjacent to the barn.

PUBLIC DISPLAY & RESPONSIBILITY

- 1. Animals in this department will be on display to the public from 8:30 am to 9:30 pm daily.
- 2. Exhibitors will be under the control and direction of the Superintendent, but the Fair Association will be, in no case, responsible for any loss or damage that may occur.
- 3. Any animal deemed unsafe or ill will not be able to go in the show ring.
- 4. Each exhibitor will be responsible for any loss, injury or damage done by or arising from any animals exhibited by him.
- 5. Animals must be shown by 4-H or FFA members without assistance.
- 6. Junior Dairy exhibitors must show at least one (1) entry in each class in which they have an animal entered.
- 7. If any Junior Dairy exhibitor enters multiple animals in the Junior Dairy Show, he/she must show at least one (1) entry in each class in which they have animals entered.
- 8. Junior exhibitors may enter multiple animals in any Junior Dairy Show class (except showmanship classes) but each animal must be shown by a junior exhibitor.
- 9. Exhibits/Canopies must not extend into the aisles.
- 10. Junior exhibitors may not be assisted by adult(s).
- 11. Any animal deemed unsafe, uncontrollable, or unhealthy by the Fair Veterinarian, and/or Cattle Superintendent will be sent back to the barn and/or home (at the discretion of the people listed above) and will not return to this year's fair.

VETERINARIAN POLICY

- 1. Names and telephone numbers of qualified local veterinarians will be posted in the Superintendent's office.
- 2. Exhibitor is responsible for payment of any veterinary care performed on their animal(s) from an on-site veterinarian.

MISTREATMENT OF ANIMAL

Fair management reserves the right to remove any exhibitor from the grounds who is deemed to be mistreating any animal.

SICK ANIMALS

May be released immediately, if a statement signed by a veterinarian is presented to the Superintendent.

HOT SHOWERS

Available for cattle exhibitors daily from 8:00 am-10:30 am and 5:00 pm-10:30 pm.

NO DOGS OR PETS

- 1. Other than service animals, no dogs or pets shall be permitted on the fairgrounds or in exhibit buildings during the fair except when confined within the campgrounds or unless they are part of an authorized act or exhibit.
- 2. Pets in the campgrounds must always be leashed.

SIGNS

The SC State Fair management reserves the right to refuse permission for any individual exhibitor to erect or display any sign of objectionable size or content.

NOTICES

- 1. No alcoholic beverages are permitted on the fairgrounds.
- 2. Smoking and/or vaping is not permitted in any building on the fairgrounds or in Kiddy Land.
- 3. The consumption and/or distribution of edible products is prohibited in all livestock areas.

RULE INTERPRETATION

Show officials reserve the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations and to settle and determine all matters, questions, or differences in regard thereto or connection with no incident to the show.

RELEASE

- 1. Cattle will be released at the end of activities on Sunday.
- 2. Any exhibitor removing animals without official release, not maintaining cattle and space, or failing to remove manure from exhibit to proper area, will forfeit all premiums (prize monies).

DAIRY PRODUCTION RECOGNITION

To be qualified for production recognition, the following 2X M.E. records must be met in pounds:

- AYRSHIRE 17,000 LBS.
- BROWN SWISS 17,500 LBS.
- GUERNSEY 17,250 LBS.
- HOLSTEIN 20,475 LBS.
- JERSEY 18,451 LBS.
- The premium will be increased by 50% on any animal showing in the Milking Cow Classes, which has a 305 day, 2X M.E. record of 2,000 pounds of milk above the State DHIA average for the breed for the prior testing year. The premium will be increased by 50% on any animal showing in the Milking Cow Classes, which has a 305 day, 2X M.E. record of 2,000 pounds of milk above the State DHIA average for the breed for the prior testing year.
- 2. The lactation considered will be the most recent completed record while officially projected first lactation records may also qualify.
- 3. Either the DHIA Individual Cow Page (DHI-203) or a monthly Report (DHI-200) must be presented to the Superintendent for verification prior to the show.
- 4. No handwritten or phone call information will be accepted.

AWARDS

SC STATE FAIR PRESIDENT'S CHOICE AWARD

Open Dairy – \$300 +Silver Belt Buckle Junior Dairy – \$450 +Silver Belt Buckle

Purpose:

The President's Award was designed to bestow the highest recognition to an outstanding exhibitor of the South Carolina State Fair who has demonstrated exceptional involvement in the livestock industry and is an advocate for agriculture and livestock education. The President's Choice Award is considered the highest honor at the South Carolina State Fair.

Selection:

President Award Recipients will be selected in the following species: Jr Beef, Open Beef, Jr Dairy, Open Dairy, Dairy Goat, Jr Market Goat, Jr Market Lamb, Jr Sheep, Smallstock, Jr Swine, Open Swine, and Youth Horse.

Guidelines:

The South Carolina State Fair President's Competition is open to all 2024 South Carolina State Fair youth and open exhibitors (exhibitor is defined as an individual that exhibits an animal show in a minimum of one class in one specie show and receives an official placing by the judge.)

Contestants may only compete in one specie area in which they are currently exhibiting.

Once a youth exhibitor is recognized with the President's Award, they will not be eligible to compete for this award in the same species again. Youth winners are eligible to compete in the open division in future years.

Once an open exhibitor is recognized with the President's Award, they will not be eligible to compete in future years.

Selection Information:

This distinguished award will be selected by the specie superintendent and the specie support staff.

The intent of this prestigious award is determined on the following criteria: Exhibits will be evaluated each day of the designated specie show by the specie superintendent and the South Carolina State Fair Show Staff. There will be separate awards for:

- Cleanliness of the exhibit area from the conclusion of species check in through the conclusion of the specie show.
- The aisles must be kept clean. Feed and water pails should be neat, clean, and removed from the stalls/pens when not in use.
- Identification such as stall cards, farm signs are highly encouraged.
- Manure must be removed from stalls/pens and placed in appropriate containers/areas.
- The appearance of animals should be clean and always cared for.
- Livestock should be in the barn/stall area when not being groomed or shown.
- Courtesy to other exhibitors, spectators and show officials will count towards the award. Disregard for show and facility rules and regulations will count against award calculations.
- Positive interaction with the public during the designated specie competition time frame.

PREMIER BREEDER BANNERS (5) Presented by The South Carolina State Fair to the Premier Breeder in each dairy breed.

The Breeder winning the most points on no more than six animals in the open single classes, exhibited by himself/herself and/or other exhibitors shall be designated the Premier Breeder. The point system for determining Premier Breeder is as follows:

- Placings 1st 2nd 3rd 4th 5th 6th 7th 8th 9th 10th
- Points Senior Females 20 18 16 14 12 10 8 6 4 2
- Points Junior Females 10 9 8 7 6 5 4 3 2 1

PREMIER EXHIBITOR AWARD: The exhibitor winning the most points on no more than six animals owned and exhibited by himself/herself in the open single classes shall be designated the Premier Exhibitor. The scale of points will be the same as that for determining Premier Breeder.

THE SOUTH CAROLINA GUERNSEY ASSOCIATION AWARD: Awarded to the Open Guernsey Show Grand Champion, sponsored by Doug Sims, Clinton SC.

The South Carolina Guernsey Association will also present the following 4-H Awards:

- **THE MARVIN J. HAMM AWARD** sponsored by Jody Hamm family of Newberry, SC and awarded to the Senior Guernsey Showmanship winner.
- **THE THOMAS H. KELLY, SR. AWARD** sponsored by Thomas H. Kelly Family of Union, SC and awarded to the Junior Guernsey Showmanship winner.
- **THE MARFRED FARM AWARD** sponsored by Marfred Farms of Saluda, SC and awarded to Guernsey Junior Champions and Grand Champions in the Junior Show.
- **THE MELLDORO FARM AWARD** sponsored by Mellwood Coleman Family of Saluda, SC and awarded to the Novice Guernsey Showmanship winner.
- **THE LUSHACRES FARM AWARD** sponsored by Lushacres Farm of Clinton, SC in memory of Mr. and Mrs. Herbner and awarded to top individuals of 4-H Guernsey Heifer Project classes in Junior Show.

SCHOLARSHIPS

- 1. The SC Farm Bureau Federation is proud to sponsor a \$2,500 Dairy Scholarship annually. Must be present to win!
- 2. The SC State Fair is proud to sponsor a \$2,000 Dairy Scholarship for Jr Dairy Supreme Champion annually. Must be present to win!
- Once exhibitor is enrolled in college, he/she should contact the SC State Fair and funds will be sent to the school.
- Recipients of the Jr Dairy Champion Supreme Scholarship will be eligible for SC Farm Bureau Scholarship once of age.
- Grand Champion exhibitors competing for Jr Dairy Supreme Champion must be the exhibitors of the Jr Supreme Champion class.

AWARDS

1st – 10th class placings Champion – Rosette Reserve Champion – Rosette Grand Champion – Banner Reserve Grand Champion – Banner Premier Breeder – Banner Premier Exhibitor – Banner

JUNIOR DAIRY SHOWMANSHIP INFORMATION

JR DAIRY SHOWMANSHIP DIVISIONS

- NOVICE: For Junior members between five (5) and nine (9) years of age as of January 1 of the current year. The top two (2) individuals from the Novice Division Showmanship class will be eligible to compete for the Dixon and Anne Lee Novice Showmanship Award. These individuals will not be placed during the competition but will be placed during the Lee Award competition. Previous Dixon & Lee Award winners will not be allowed to compete in any showmanship classes but may move up to a Junior Showmanship class. The Dixon and Anne Lee Novice Showmanship Award is sponsored by Tom and Tracey Dobbins.
- 2. JUNIOR: For Junior members between ten (10) and fourteen (14) years of age as of January 1 of the current year. The top two (2) individuals from the Junior Division Showmanship class will be eligible to compete for the Fred E. Pardue Junior Showmanship Award. These individuals will not be placed during the breed competition but will be placed during the Pardue Award competition. Previous winners will not be allowed to compete in any Junior Showmanship classes but may move up to a Senior Showmanship class. The Fred E. Pardue Award is sponsored by Tom and Tracey Dobbins.
- 3. SENIOR: For Junior members between fifteen (15) and eighteen (18) years of age as of January 1 of the current year and must be enrolled in a high school. The top two (2) individuals from the Senior Division Showmanship Classes of each breed will be eligible to compete for the Commissioner's Cup Senior Showmanship Award. These individuals will not be placed during the competition for the Commissioner's Cup. Previous winners will not be allowed to compete in any senior showmanship classes. The Commissioner's Cup is sponsored by the Family of Mark Keith.
- 4. COLLEGIATE: For Junior members between seventeen (17) and twenty-one (21) years of age as of show date and must be enrolled in a college or technical school.

JR DAIRY SHOWMANSHIP AWARDS REQUIREMENTS & SCORECARD

- 1. Junior Dairy members will be allowed to compete in only one (1) showmanship group.
- 2. Animals must be shown by their owner.
- 3. A show harness must be worn by the 4-H'er with the correct number from the type of class for the animal he/she is exhibiting.
- 4. Animals in Showmanship classes must be registered during check-in.

Showmanship divisions will be judged according to the following scorecard:

- Showmanship ability 70 points
- Appearance of animal 20 points
- Appearance of exhibitor 10 points
