SOUTH CAROLINA ROSE SOCIETY SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

- The South Carolina State Fair General Rules and Regulations shall apply in conjunction with the South Carolina State Fair Flower Show General Rules and Regulations.
- 2. Design Reservations must be made in advance with William Patterson at (864) 682-7673 or laurensroseman@aol.com by Sunday, October 5th.
- 3. Entries will be accepted from 7:00 AM -10:00 AM on Friday, October 10
- 4. All exhibitors must sign in and provide their complete US mailing address.
- 5. Everyone is eligible to enter roses in the rose show. Exhibitors must have grown all entries in his or her own private outdoor garden. Exhibitors may enter as many roses as desired, provided each is a different variety. Spouses and Partners must enter as a team.
- 6. The Show Committee will furnish official entry tags and uniform containers. Both the top and bottom section of the entry tag must be completed. Classification as to variety and type will be in accordance with the current editions of Modern Roses, The Official List of Approved Exhibition Names for Judges and Exhibitors, The Handbook for Selecting Roses, The American Rose Annual, and The Combined Rose List. A rose with two or more names must be entered under its ARS approved name or code name. Entries will be placed alphabetically by variety within each class. Challenge Classes are to be placed by the exhibitor. Judges will disqualify for the following:
 - 1. A foreign substance that has been applied to enhance the beauty of the entry.
 - 2. Misnamed. The name of the rose is neither the variety name given on the entry tag nor an accepted synonym thereof.
 - 3. Unlabeled or Mislabeled. Entry lacks an entry tag or the exhibitor's name, the class number and/or the name of the variety is not given on the entry tag.
 - 4. Exhibitor's name visible, if not corrected before the entry is judged.
 - 5. An entry that was not grown outdoors.
 - 6. An entry that was not grown by the exhibitor.
 - 7. Violation of rose show rules.
 - a. A challenge class or collection entry that does not satisfy the composition and/or staging requirements of the class in which it is entered.
 - b. an entry in a class with restricted eligibility that the exhibitor is not eligible to enter.

- c. When expressly prohibited by the show rules, entries made in the name of an absent exhibitor.
- d. Unless expressly permitted by the show rules, separate entries from the same garden by two or more exhibitors.
- 7. Wedging is permitted to stage a specimen in the container but should not be visible above the top of the vase.
- 8. Ribbons for First, Second, Third and Fourth Place may be awarded. Cash awards of \$1.00 for First Place and \$.50 for Second Place will be awarded. There are no cash awards for Third and Fourth Place. The South Carolina Rose Society will pay all awards.
- 9. Neither the South Carolina State Fair, the South Carolina Rose Society, its members nor the Show Committee shall be responsible for any personal injury, damage or loss of any property belonging to an exhibitor. All due precautions will be taken, but owners must assume risk.
- 10. Roses entered in show become the property of the Show Committee.
- 11. The Show Chairman shall be the final authority in matters of dispute.

SOUTH CAROLINA ROSE SOCIETY HORTICULTURE CLASSES

ENGLISH BOXES

English Boxes will be issued on a first come, first served basis.

CLASS 1. Six (6) Hybrid Teas or Grandifloras, no more than two (2) blooms of a variety, exhibition stage, without foliage, one entry tag.

CLASS 2. Six (6) Miniatures or Mini floras, no more than two (2) blooms of a variety, exhibition stage, without foliage, one entry tag.

SOUTH CAROLINA ROSE SOCIETY CHALLENGE CLASS

Note: Classes 3 and 4 are open only to current members of the South Carolina Rose Society; only one entry is allowed per exhibitor or exhibiting team. Containers will be issued on a first come first serve basis.

CLASS 3. THE BOB AND SANDY LUNDBERG MEMORIAL CHALLENGE

Five (5) Miniature blooms, one bloom per stem, exhibition stage, exhibited in one container, one entry tag. Each a different variety.

CLASS 4. THE MICHAEL C. WILLIAMS MEMORIAL CHALLENGE

A collection of six (6) or more one-bloom-per-stem specimens, exhibition stage, hybridized by Michael C. Williams, staged in a clear container. Each a separate variety and listed on one entry tag.

LARGE ROSES

CLASS 5. HYBRID TEAS AND GRANDIFLORAS

Individual one-bloom-per-stem Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora specimen, exhibition stage. Eligible for QUEEN, KING, PRINCESS, and four (4) COURT OF HONOR awards. ARS Certificates will be awarded.

CLASS 6. LIGHTLY PETALED HYBRID TEAS

Individual lightly petaled Hybrid Teas (4 - 12 petals), and those varieties classified by ARS as singles; May be one bloom or spray.

CLASS 7. HYBRID TEA OR GRANDIFLORA SPRAY

Individual Hybrid Tea spray or Grandiflora spray specimen. Lightly petaled hybrid teas/Grandiflora (4-12 petals) are excluded from this class.

CLASS 8. FLORIBUNDAS

Individual one-bloom-per-stem Floribunda specimen, exhibition stage. **THE PRINCE OF SHOW** will be selected from this class.

CLASS 9. FLORIBUNDA SPRAY

Individual Floribunda spray specimen. Discreet disbudding permitted. **THE DUCHESS OF SHOW will be selected from this class**.

CLASS 10. FULLY OPEN ROSE

Individual one-bloom-per-stem Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora specimen, fully open with stamens showing. Lightly petaled hybrid teas/Grandifloras (4 - 12 petals) are excluded from this class

CLASS 11. POLYANTHA SPRAY

Individual polyantha spray specimen. Discreet disbudding permitted.

OLD GARDEN ROSES

CLASS 12. DOWAGER QUEEN

Individual specimen, may be one bloom or spray, naturally grown or discreetly disbudded. Please list the date of introduction on the top righthand corner of the entry tag. Variety must have been introduced prior to 1867.

CLASS 13. VICTORIAN ROSE

Individual specimen, may be one bloom or spray, naturally grown or discreetly disbudded. Please list the date of introduction on the top righthand corner of the entry tag. Variety must have been introduced in or after 1867 or have an unknown date of introduction.

LARGE ROSES-MISCELLANEOUS CLASSES

CLASS 14. SPECIES ROSES

Individual specimen, may be one bloom or spray, naturally grown or discreetly disbudded. Eligible for Genesis Award.

CLASS 15. CLASSIC SHRUBS

Includes Hybrid Kordesii, Hybrid Moyesii, Hybrid Rugosa and Hybrid Musk roses. Individual specimen, **may be one bloom or spray**, naturally grown or discreetly disbudded.

CLASS 16. MODERN SHRUBS

Includes all roses classified as Shrubs (S) by the ARS. Individual specimen, **may be one bloom or spray**, naturally grown or discreetly disbudded.

CLASS 17. CLIMBERS

Includes Large-Flowered Climbers, Hybrid Gigantea and Hybrid Wichuranas. Individual specimen, may be one bloom or spray, naturally grown or discreetly disbudded.

CLASS 18. CYCLE OF BLOOM

Three (3) one-bloom-per-stem Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora specimens, **same variety**, **one container**; one specimen one fourth open (bud), one specimen one half to three fourths open (exhibition stage), and one specimen fully open with stamens showing.

CLASS 19. HI-LO MATCHING PAIR

One (1) individual one-bloom-per-stem Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora specimen, and one (1) individual one bloom-per-stem matching Miniature or Miniflora specimen, exhibition stage, **separate containers with individual entry tags**. Specimens should match in form and color, **place Miniature or Mini flora specimen in front.**

CLASS 20. THREE FLORIBUNDA SPRAY VARIETIES

Three (3) Floribunda spray specimens, exhibition stage, **one container**, **one entry tag.**

CLASS 21. THREE DAVID AUSTIN VARIETIES

Three (3) one-bloom-per-stem <u>English</u> specimens, exhibition stage, **different varieties**, **one container**, **one entry tag**.

CLASS 22. DECORATIVE ROSE VARIETY

One-bloom-per-stem **<u>Decorative</u>** (bloom that does not have HT high-pointed center and symmetrical spiral of petals).

CLASS 23. ROSE IN A BOWL

One exhibition specimen (excludes Minis & Minifloras) floating in a container furnished by the rose committee. Limit two (2) entries per exhibitor or exhibiting team. No foliage permitted.

MINIATURE ROSES (EXCLUDES MINIFLORAS)

CLASS 24. MINIATURES

Individual one-bloom-per-stem Miniature specimen, exhibition stage. *Eligible for MINI QUEEN, KING, PRINCESS, and four (4) COURT OF HONOR awards. ARS Certificates will be awarded.*

CLASS 25. MINIATURE SPRAYS

Individual Miniature spray specimen. Lightly petaled (4-12 petals) is excluded from this class). THE MINIATURE PRINCE will be selected from this class.

CLASS 26. LIGHTLY PETALED MINIATURES

Individual one-bloom-per-stem lightly petaled Miniature (4-12 petals) specimen, and those varieties classified by ARS as singles which may be one bloom or spray.

MINIFLORA ROSES (EXCLUDES MINIATURES)

CLASS 27. MINIFLORAS

Individual one-bloom-per-stem Miniflora specimen, exhibition stage. *Eligible for MINI FLORA QUEEN, KING, PRINCESS, and four (4) COURT OF HONOR awards. ARS Certificates will be awarded.*

CLASS 28. MINIFLORA SPRAYS

Individual Miniflora spray specimen. Lightly petaled (4-12 petals) Miniflora are excluded from this class. MINIFLORA PRINCE will be selected from this class.

CLASS 29. LIGHTLY PETALED MINIFLORAS

Individual one bloom per stem lightly petaled Miniflora (4-12 petals) specimen, and those varieties classed by ARS as singles: **May be one bloom or spray**.

MINIATURE AND MINIFLORA ROSE MISCELLANEOUS CLASSES

CLASS 30. FULLY OPEN

Individual one-bloom-per-stem Miniature or Miniflora fully open specimen with stamens showing. Lightly petaled miniatures (4-12 petals) are excluded from this class.

MINIATURE DUCHESS will be chosen from this class.

CLASS 31. CYCLE OF BLOOM

Three (3) individual one-bloom-per-stem Miniature or Miniflora specimens, **same variety, one container**; one specimen one fourth open (bud), one specimen one half to three fourths open (exhibition stage), and one specimen fully open (stamens showing).

CLASS 32. ROSE IN A BOWL

One exhibition Miniature or Miniflora specimen floating in a plastic container furnished by the show committee. Limit two entries per exhibitor or exhibiting team. No foliage permitted.

CLASS 33. THREE SAME VARIETY

Three (3) individual one-bloom-per-stem Miniature or Miniflora specimens, exhibition stage, same variety, one container, one entry tag.

CLASS 34. THREE DIFFERENT VARIETIES

Three (3) individual one-bloom-per-stem Miniature and or Miniflora specimens, exhibition stage, **different varieties**, **one container**, **one entry tag**.

CLASS 35. FIVE SAME VARIETY

Five (5) individual one-bloom-per-stem Miniature or Miniflora specimens, exhibition stage, **same variety, one container, one entry tag**.

CLASS 36. FIVE DIFFERENT VARIETIES

Five (5) individual one-bloom-per-stem Miniature and or Miniflora specimens, exhibition stage, **different varieties**, **one container**, **one entry tag**.

Class 37. One-bloom-per-stem <u>Decorative</u> Mini/Miniflora (bloom that does not have high-pointed center and symmetrical spiral of petals).

NOVICE CLASSES

Entries are limited to exhibitors who have never won a blue ribbon in an ARS sponsored show.

CLASS 38. NOVICE HYBRID TEA OR GRANDIFLORA

Individual one-bloom-per-stem Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora specimen, exhibition stage. *Eligible for NOVICE QUEEN and/or QUEEN OF SHOW.*

CLASS 39. NOVICE MINIATURE OR MINI FLORA

Individual one-bloom-per-stem Miniature or Mini flora specimen, exhibition stage. *Eligible for NOVICE KING and/or KING OF SHOW.*

CLASS 40. NOVICE SHRUBS, CLIMBERS OR OGR'S

Individual exhibition specimen or spray. Eligible for NOVICE PRINCESS.

JUDGES CLASSES

Entries are limited to ARS horticulture and arrangements judges judging in this show.

NOTE: Judges judging arrangements are encouraged to enter all open horticulture classes; judges judging horticulture are encouraged to enter all open arrangements classes.

CLASS 41. JUDGES HYBRID TEA OR GRANDIFLORA

Individual or collection of one-bloom-per-stem Hybrid Tea and or Grandiflora specimen(s), exhibition stage, one container, one entry tag. *Eligible for ARS JUDGES CERTIFICATE*.

CLASS 42. JUDGES MINIATURE OR MINIFLORA

Individual or collection of one-bloom-per-stem Mini flora and or Miniature specimen(s), exhibition stage, **one container**, **one entry tag**. *Eligible for ARS JUDGES CERTIFICATE*.

CLASS 43. JUDGES SHRUBS, CLIMBERS AND OLD GARDEN ROSES

Individual or collection of shrubs and/or climber and/or old garden rose specimen(s), one container, one entry tag. *Eligible for ARS JUDGES CERTIFICATE*.

MISCELLANEOUS CLASSES

CLASS 44. FRAGRANT ROSE

Individual or collection of any fragrant rose variety, one container, **one entry tag,** judged for fragrance only.

Class 45. Junior Rose: <u>Sixteen or younger in age</u>, individual or spray rose variety, exhibition stage, one container, one entry tag,

Photography Division

Photography Division Rules

- 1. All roses shown in the photography entries MUST have been grown in an outdoor garden but need not have been grown by the exhibitor.
- 2. All photographs MUST be the work of the exhibitor.
- 3. Exhibitors may enter up to two (2) entries in each class.
- 4. Previous winning photographs, defined as First through and including Third place in the ARS American Rose magazine contest or any ARS national, district or local contest MAY NOT be entered in this photography competition.
- 5. All photographs are to be 5" x 7" with no mat or frame-orientation of either portrait or landscape.

- 6. All rights to the exhibited photographs are to be retained by the owners of the photograph; however, by submitted a photograph to the contest, the exhibitor warrants that he/she owns the copyright of the submitted photograph. Photos not claimed by 6 pm on Sunday, October 12th will become property of the SCRS.
- 7. Rose varieties photographed MUST be entered using ARS approved exhibition names as listed in the following publications: Modern Roses 12 (book and data base), the Official List of Approved Exhibition Names for Judges and Exhibitors, The Handbook for Selecting Roses, or recent registrations on the ARS website. In instances where a variety is NOT listed in any of the above ARS Rose publications, a listing in the Combined Rose List (CRL) is acceptable.
- 8. A completed (top and bottom) miniature entry tag must be attached/taped to the back of the photograph.

Photography Classes

Class P1: One bloom of a Hybrid Tea (exhibition form), Grandiflora, Floribunda, Shrub, Old Garden Rose, Miniature or Miniflora rose (exhibition form). Roses designated as "lightly petaled" (e.g. Lightly petaled HT 4-12 petals, etc.) MUST be entered in Class 2.

Class P2: One bloom of a Hybrid Tea, Grandiflora, Floribunda, Shrub, Old Garden Rose, Miniature or Miniflora rose, fully open, stamens MUST show. Roses classified by the ARS as "lightly petaled" (4-12 petals) ARE permitted in this class.

Class P3: Blooms with Critters: A photograph of any rose or blooms with a critter such as a bee, butterfly, pet or other friendly creature. Roses MUST be identified.

Class P4: A spray of roses (2 or more blooms) of any classification.
Class P5: Garden: A photo of any rose garden. Photographs should show the use of roses within the structure of a garden, which can be widely variable.
Roses should dominate in the photograph, and some layout of the garden should be visible. Roses do not need to be identified. If a public garden is used, the name of the garden MUST be listed on back of entry tag.
Class P6: Arrangements: A photo of any style arrangement, miniature or standard, following the ARS Guidelines for Judging Rose Arrangements. The arranger's name MUST be indicated
